1. Update on the implementation of the Queenstown Spatial Plan

The report author was Ms Anita Vanstone (Strategic Growth Manager). The report provided an update on the latest Grow Well Whaiora Spatial Plan Monitoring Report and the implementation of the Joint Housing Action Plan and Te Tapuae Southern Corridor Structure Plan.

Ms Vanstone, Ms Marsh, Ms Irwin and Ms Morss presented the report and responded to questions on whether there is current funding for A2 and A7, whether the traffic light system accurately reflects the current risk level, whether Council has undertaken a risk assessment on infrastructure in case the fast-tracked projects are approved, provisions for local generation of power, and whether the Queenstown Chamber of Commerce is involved in the implementation of the Spatial Plan.

Mr Vanstone noted that the project plan was in draft form and that there would be an update at a subsequent meeting.
